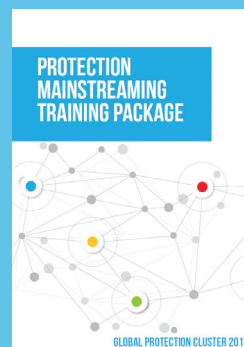

Humanitarian Advisory Group has worked with the Global Protection Cluster providing subject matter expertise, training material development and facilitation skills to support the GPC mission 'to improve the predictability, leadership, effectiveness and accountability of response operations'.



In 2014 HAG led on the development of a training manual that was rolled out across multiple countries and has subsequently been translated into French, Spanish and Arabic. HAG co-led the training of trainers to develop a cadre of trainers that were able to support the roll out process. Most recently HAG was invited to facilitate the GPC Annual Retreat in Geneva that brought together representatives from over 35 countries to share learning and experiences of protection response operations in countries including Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan and Libya.
